INTRODUCING THE CENTRE FOR CHURCH AND CULTURE

In society today, many church leaders are under-resourced and under-supported in their congregational spiritual work. Society is becoming increasingly complex—and polarized. As a result, churches require careful reflection to thoughtfully explore tough questions and address new challenges.

Throughout its history, MDC has supported Christian leaders by educating them for ministry. We have traditionally done this by means of ministerial degrees, but it has become increasingly clear that

the pace of cultural change now requires greater attention to both formal and informal ongoing education. While it has never been ideal for a pastor to rely solely on their foundational seminary degree for the duration of a lengthy ministerial career, in today's culture, it is inconceivable.

The vision for the Centre for Church and Culture (CCC) is to provide an interactive educational environment to enable pastors and other Christian leaders to address urgent and relevant cultural issues that may threaten the Christian church. The formation of this Centre will create new opportunities for informal ongoing education resources for the benefit of the Church.

This new Centre aims to achieve the following goals:

- To engage contemporary Christian leaders with expert resources on complex issues emerging in the context of Christian ministry in Canada today.
- To advance the understanding of complex issues facing the church in contemporary culture through collaborative engagement with Christian leaders and careful listening.
- To advance the flourishing of congregational leaders in Christian ministry in Canada through educational initiatives designed to support ongoing cultural engagement.
- To expand and multiply high quality research on critical issues facing the church and explore their practical implications for contemporary ministry in the Canadian context.



Dr. John W. Hilber, Professor of Old Testament at McMaster Divinity College, has been named the Director of the new Centre for Church and Culture, "Having spent the first half of my career in pastoral ministry, I appreciate the value of an academic institution that seeks to partner with church leaders to facilitate important conversations around emerging cultural issues. It's thrilling to be part of MDC's efforts to address that need today."

The primary work of the Centre for Church and Culture is focused on the biennial symposium, with the inaugural event having taken place this past year. This event is a gathering of scholars and ministry professionals on a relevant topic for the benefit of the church. Other activities and events including networking and learning events like a "Lunch & Learn" for pastors, webinars, newsletters, and more.

Students currently enrolled in our Church and Culture specializations stream will have the opportunity to gather and mutually benefit from collaborating with experienced professionals in ministry and share their research.
