

HEATHER'S STORY



My name is Heather Whitehead and I am a first year student in the MTS program. I started here in the spring of 2021, and this is my story of how I came to study here at McMaster Divinity College.

When 2020 started, and COVID was little more than a whisper, I was diagnosed

with cervical cancer. My faith at the time was about the size of a mustard seed. I believed in God, and I believed in Jesus, but that was about the extent of my faith. As you can imagine, dealing with cancer in a pandemic presented some unique challenges, but God didn't give up on me. He used my diagnosis as an opportunity to bring certain people into my life that would ultimately set me on a course to come back to my faith, and by the end of 2020, I could see the cancer as a blessing. Of course, I never

want to go through those experiences again, but I know God used it for transformation. 2020 wasn't the year I had cancer, but the year I came back to my faith.

Along the way I felt that God was saying to me, "I called you for so much more", but through prayer and some people speaking into my life, it became clear that he was calling me to ministry. I didn't think I was qualified to pursue a master's degree in theology, but God closed doors and opened others, leading me to MDC. I can see his hand in all the little details that have gotten me here, so I am confident this is exactly where I am supposed to be.

Now, as I complete my second semester, one of the things I have come to really appreciate about McMaster is the number of denominations represented. I love learning from others and hearing different viewpoints that challenge my thinking and allow me to grow. I thank God for his guidance in leading me here and look forward to one day being able to pastor, using my past experiences to help lost and broken people find God.



The mission of McMaster Divinity College is to develop effective Christian leaders for the Church, academy, and society. The faculty has been strategizing for some time about how we do that well in the 21st century with the changes in culture, new challenges for the church, and differences in the needs and goals of our students.

I believe that the challenge of the pandemic has pushed us into new ground in that venture. Previous to any notion of a pandemic or lockdown, we had been developing some courses online, but last year we moved to teaching all our courses online. Now, this year, with the changes in Ontario guidelines, we are undergoing a period of transition. Each course has taken one of three forms: we had courses on campus for our research programs, courses online for our DPT students, and hybrid courses for professional students, where on campus sessions and online sessions alternated week by week. In addition to that, there were also students with unique circumstances who were able to "stream in" to attend their courses. If this seems complex to you, it was for all of us too! It has required major upgrades in classroom technology, and

previously unimaginable adjustments on the part of the faculty and particularly for the MDC technical support. Some things worked well, and some things have required unforeseen adjustments and always patience! One of the unforeseen ways that God has been working in this time has been to open more channels of communication with my students, and often richer interaction in class.

As a whole, MDC faculty, students, and staff have gained experience and developed diverse toolkits that will allow us much more flexibility so that we are able to approach our curriculum and delivery with increased intentionality—it gives us something to look forward to in the next semester and as we forge ahead with our mission in the 21st century.
